And I am further happy to report most favorably of the two Prisoners in question. In fact their conduct throughout and up to date has been most exemplary correct. And I would beg respectfully to suggest that the two Prisoners named be granted "Letters of License," and be embarked for Port Blair by the first Government transport leaving this Presidency for that Settlement. I am induced to make this suggestion because Penal Servitude Prisoners are occasionally permitted to proceed to Port Blair, and which is an indulgence they highly appreciate and acts as a stimulus and impetus to good conduct particularly if two men so well behaved as Scott and Jackson are selected in the present instance for transfer to Port Blair.

WITH reference to your letter No. 3448, dated the 10th instants and its enclosure, I am directed to point out that by Government Orders No. 3575, dated the 4th July last, a report was called for on the conduct of the prisoners W. H. Jackson and Gilbert Scott, confined in the Calcutta Jail under sentence of Penal Servitude, when they should have respectively completed two and three years of their terms, not before the completion of such terms.

[No. 54.] From F. J. MOUNT, Esq., M. D., Inspector-General of Jails, Lower Provinces, to J. GROHMAN, Esq., Under-Secretary to the Government of Bengal,—(No. 3461, dated the 2nd February 1865.)

IN reply to your letter No. 384, dated the 18th ultimo, I have the honor to intimate that I consider a Jailor, who understands English and can keep the records of the Jail, to be absolutely necessary, as the Officers in charge assert that they have no Establishment of any kind for the performance of the duty in question, and I have the greatest difficulty in getting any Statements from the Sonthal Pergunnahs. A Naib would certainly not be needed. I believe that a Jailor, to keep records in English, cannot be procured for a lower salary than that mentioned.

[No. 55.] From J. GROHMAN, Esq., Under-Secretary to the Government of Bengal, to the Inspector-General of Jails, Lower Provinces,—(No. 1214, dated the 28th February 1865.)

I AM directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 3461, dated 2nd instant, on the subject of the Establishment necessary for the Jail, of the Sonthal Pergunnahs, and in reply to state that, if the orders for reducing all these Jails, except that at Rajmehal, to the status of Lock-ups have been duly carried out, the Lieutenant-Governor cannot allow any weight to the argument of the Assistant Commissioners cited by you.

2. The returns of a Lock-up where no manufactures are carried on and where no prisoner is confined whose sentence exceeds fifteen days, are not, it appears to the Lieutenant-Governor, of such a heavy and complicated nature as to require the employment of a Writer on Rupees 50 a month to draw them up. In all other Lock-ups in Bengal this duty is, without difficulty, performed by one of the Ministerial Officers subordinate to the Magistrate in charge of the Sub-Division, and His Honor at present sees no reason why the same practice should not be followed in the Lock-ups of the Sonthal Pergunnahs. You are therefore requested to re-consider the matter with reference to the above remarks and to report, for the orders of the Lieutenant-Governor, what Establishment you consider absolutely necessary for the Lock-ups of Deoghur, Godda, Pakour and Nya Doomka.
