ACCOUNTS OF LOCAL FUNDS—. Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals observed that the rules issued by the Accountant-General for the guidance, in matters of accounts, of managing committees of dispensaries and local authorities, have the effect of defeating the object with which the orders contained in Government Resolution No. 523 T.—M., dated the 2nd November, 1893, was issued, and represented the desirability of permitting managing committees to have direct transactions with the treasury, their accounts being kept separate from those of the local authorities in order to obviate delays in payment of bills and misunderstanding on the part of the general public as to the utilisation of the funds by public subscription. He was told, in reply, that the law, as it stood, did not permit of the dissociation of the accounts of the dispensary committees from those of the controlling local authorities, nor was it clear that in all cases such dissociation was desirable. So far as the Government was aware there was no indication that dispensary accounts were mismanaged by the municipal establishment, or that the present rules have prevented the flow of private charity; on the contrary, there was a large increase of private subscription during the year 1901. If there are defects in the administration of any particular Municipalities and District Boards, the attention of the local officer concerned could be called to them, or a circular issued if such defects were general, and it was open to the Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals to bring to the notice of Government any point he would desire to emphasise in such circular and, if in any particular instance trouble is caused by delay in making payment or in any other way, the Civil Surgeon can seek redress through the Magistrate of the district
