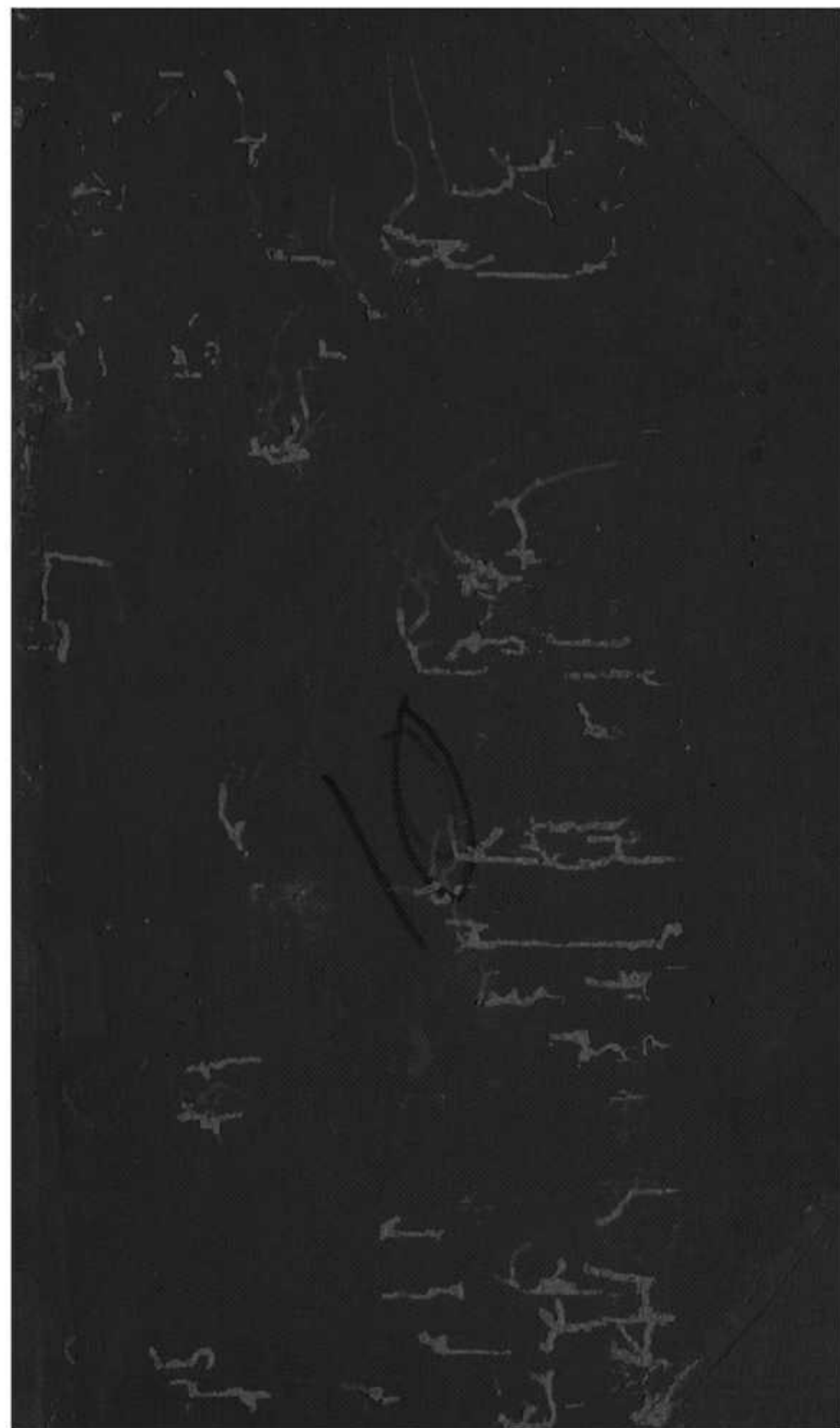

PENSION OF REVENUE—
