CONFISCATION OF GOODS FOUND ON BOARD OF THE SHIPS ENGAGED FOR WAR—	
Calcutta. In the agreement for the ships which were taken up by the Marine Board to serve as transports on the late expedition, it was stipulated that the whole tonnage of the ships should be at the disposal of Government, and that, if any goods by way of traffic should be discovered on board of them, the same should be liable to confiscation. Two of these ships <i>Nancy</i> and <i>Chichester</i> on their return to Bengal were found to contain a quantity of merchandize. On calling for an explanation the Commanders of the ships stated that they were obliged to take the goods as ballast on the certificates granted to them by Major Hamilton. As the owners, in fairness, on the return of the ships, did not report the circumstance to the Marine Board, which they ought to have done, Board reported to Government that as Government had hired the whole capacity of the ships the owners were justly chargeable with freight and something more by way of penalty. Government ordered the freight to be charged and to inform the owners that they should consider it an act of leniency that the goods were not confiscated.
