

Razinama—A written assent, a deed of agreement or concurrence, a testimonial signed by a plaintiff at the end of a suit that he is satisfied with the decision; a deed of compromise by which the plaintiff or prosecutor acknowledges that he has been satisfied by the defendant, or a written declaration that he will be satisfied with the decision of a particular person or persons: the execution of a Razinama usually implies an amicable settlement.

Sadar—The highest or foremost of anything: the chief seat of Government, the Presidency, as opposed to the provinces or mufassal; but the term is most usually applied to denote establishments or individuals employed in the judicial and revenue administration of the State.

Sair—Revenue accruing to Government, in addition to the land-tax from a variety of imposts, as customs, transit duties, licenses, fees, house-tax, market-tax, etc.

Sanad—Deed of grant by the Government to an individual of emoluments, titles, privileges, offices or rights.

Sannyasi—A Hindu who has renounced the world and lives by mendicancy.

Sardar—Headman.

Sarishtadar—A registrar, a record-keeper applied especially to the head Indian officer of a Court of Justice or Collector's office who has the general superintendence of the establishment and charge of the public records, official documents and papers.

Sarker—An Indian servant who keeps accounts or disburses money for his employer. The Government, the State, the supreme authority of administration. Also an extensive division of country containing many parganas, a district, a province.

Sazawal—An Indian Collector of Revenue.

Shrabān—Fourth month of the Bengali year corresponding to July-August.

Shumar—Counting, reckoning, conjectural estimate.

Sibandi—Irregular soldiery: a sort of militia or imperfectly disciplined troops trained for the garrisons of forts and guards in towns and villages, and for revenue and police duties: charges in the revenue accounts for the expense of such troops.

Sicca—A silver coin of the standard value in Bengal under the East India Company's administration until changed to East India Company's rupee.

Subah—A province, a Government: one of the larger subdivisions of the Mughal dominions, such as Oudh, Bengal, Bihar, &c: among the Marhattas it is sometimes applied to a smaller division comprising from five to eight tarafs.

Tahsil—Collection of public revenue.

Tahsildar—A native collector of revenue.

Talab-Chitthi—A warrant, a summons, a written demand for arrears of rent.

Taluk—An estate smaller than a zamindari.

Talukdar—Holder of a taluk.

Talukdari—The tenure, office or estate of talukdar.

Taraf—A subdivision of a pargana.

Tauzi—A revenue account showing under the name of each payer of revenue the total amount as it falls due by monthly instalments, the portion actually paid and the balance outstanding.

Tazia—A representation or model of the tomb of Hasan and Husain, at Karbala, carried on in procession at the Muharram by the Indian Shias.

Thana—A station, a military post, a police-station.

Thanadar—An officer in charge of the thana, a petty police officer subordinate to a daroga.

Toshakhana—A store-room, a wardrobe: chambers in which objects of curiosity or value, not in daily request, are kept.

Vakil—A representative, an agent, a pleader.

Wasilaat—Collections of revenue, from every head, receipt of the proceeds of an estate, mesne profits of lands.

Zamin—Earth, land, ground.

Zamindar—An occupant of land, a landholder.

Zamindari—The office and rights of a zamindar, the tenure of a zamindari whether individual or coparcenary.

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
